Free Bus Travel	Young people can access free bus travel with their Young Scot Card or National Entitlement Card (NEC).	<ul> <li>For 5-15 year olds <ul> <li>Parents, guardians or carers of children between 5 and 15 need to apply on their child's behalf.</li> </ul> </li> <li>For 16-21 year olds <ul> <li>If you have an active NEC or Young Scot NEC already, you can download free bus travel onto your card using the Transport Scot Pass Collect app. This means you won't need to apply for a new card to access your free bus travel.</li> <li>Make sure you have your card with you when you board the bus. Tell the bus driver where you are going then tap your card on the electronic ticket machine.</li> <li>You can tell if you have an active card. Free Laptop / Device	Laptops and devices donated through Tech4families.	<ul> <li>Applications must be made by a parent or carer over the age of 18 and are to apply for a laptop for a child between the ages of 4 and 16 on the date that the application is made.</li> <li>Only one application per child is permitted.
