
Prefects

Staff Learning Together

The in-service day on Monday 18 October was given over to our second School Improvement Priority – Learning and Teaching. Our learning and teaching group have been looking at research on 'cognitive load theory' (how the working memory affects our ability to learn) and shared some of their findings with the rest of the staff. Highlights were how to adapt PowerPoint slides and presentations to reduce unnecessary information that takes up space in the working memory; ways to chunk how we model learning and problem solving to better support pupils to follow the steps required. This work will be ongoing throughout the year.
