Differences


Much larger building.

More staff/pupils.


More subjects to choose from.

S1-S3

- Secondary pupils will spend 5 or 6 years actually studying in school.
- In first year, you'll do practically every subject available. This is to allow you to experience a wide variety of subjects to see what interests you the most.
- This is continued in second year. In second year, the aim of the year will be to help you understand both the new environment and your personal interests.
- In third year, you'll narrow down your subject choices to 11 subjects, and you'll continue narrowing down your subject choices until 5th and 6th year.



S4-S6

- In fourth year, you'll be sitting your National 5s which determine what Highers you take, the other notable event is work experience.
- In fifth year, the Higher exams will start and you can begin really looking at what you'll be doing after leaving school. The results here will determine what college/university you're going to attend, so it's important to put in effort.
- Finally, in sixth year, if you choose to stay on, you'll be able to achieve more qualifications and you can attend college courses/take advanced Highers.



Work Experience

- Further up the school, you're required to partake in work experience. Work experience is a chance to look into a field of work you're interested in and see whether it's something you'd like or not.
- This experience is very beneficial and helps you understand what a working week really is.



National 5s, Highers, and Advanced Highers

- These three qualifications are important for later on in your life – particularly Highers and advanced Highers.
- Due to this, the years in which you sit them, S4/5/6, are incredibly important.
- Doing well here can make getting into higher education much easier.



Extra Curricular Activities

- In Secondary School you'll be able to take part in many different activities. Some such activities are Football, Rugby and Netball. These all run after school or during lunch.
- As well as extra curricular activities, you'll also have the chance to participate in award schemes like Duke of Edinburgh.



After Secondary

- During your senior years, you'll have to think about and plan for your immediate and long-term future.
- This can involve higher education like university/college, apprenticeships or full-time employment.
